Maryland schools, students, and educators are making great strides thanks to your activisim.

- The Blueprint for Maryland's Future, which will add \$1.1 billion over the next three years to our schools. This will go to improving salaries; hiring more staff; expanding career technical education, pre-k, and community schools; and much more.
- Raising the minimum wage to \$15, which will mean a well-deserved raise for thousands of education support professionals (ESP). For thousands of others who just barely make above the state minimum wage now, it is expected to raise their wages as well. This is a big step in the right direction in our fight to make sure that all ESP earn a living wage.
- The passage of our bill to add a dedicated seat for a teacher on the State Board of Education. We need the voices of educators at the table when decisions are being made about our profession and schools, and this bill will help make it happen.

January-April 2019

2019 General Assembly

Educators hold the March for Our Schools, the largest rally in Annapolis in nearly 10 years. Legislators pass Blueprint for Maryland's Future, adding \$1.1 billion in new school funding.

Spring-Fall 2019

A subgroup of the Kirwan Commission on school funding meets to develop recommendations on revising the state's school funding formula.

January-April 2020

2020 General Assembly

Legislators are expected to pass a new school funding formula that would phase in billions of dollars of new funding over the next decade. They are also expected to identify funding sources for the new formula to ensure that it is sustainable, adequate, and equitable.

Spring 2019

Local associations finalize negotiations and contract campaigns, utilizing the new funding from the Blueprint.

Late Fall 2019

Full Kirwan Commission meets and releases recommendations on revising the funding formula for the first time in almost 20 years. The recommendations will go to the General Assembly and Gov. Hogan.
